FOR HOLY WEEK


As a family, make an Easter tree to help illustrate the journey of Holy Week leading up to Easter.

On Good Friday cover the tree with a piece of fabric to represent Jesus death. On Sunday remove all the symbols and decorations and replace with butterflies, eggs and other symbols of new life to represent the new life we have through Jesus death and resurrection on the cross.
